The United States Bureau of Investigation is charged with the duty of investigating violations of the laws of the United States and collecting evidence in cases in which the United States is or may be a party in interest.

The Bureau does not have investigative jurisdiction over violations of the National Prohibition, Counterfeiting, Narcotic, Customs, Immigration, or Postal Laws.

However, the United States Bureau of Investigation will immediately institute investigations of alleged violations of Federal Laws other than those listed above.

The following list indicates some of the major violations over which the Bureau has investigative jurisdiction:-

National Motor Vehicle Theft Act

National Bankruptcy Act

White Slave Traffic Act

Impersonation of Government Officials

Larceny of Goods in Interstate Commerce

Cases involving transportation in interstate or foreign commerce of any persons who have been kidnapped

Theft, Embezzlement or Illegal Possession of Government Property

Antitrust Laws

National Bank and Federal Reserve Act Violations, such as embezzlement, abstraction or misapplication of funds

Crimes on any kind of Government reservation, including Indian Reservations or in any Government building or other Government property

Neutrality violations, including the shipment of arms to friendly nations

Frauds against the Government

Perjury, embezzlement, or bribery in connection with Federal Statutes or officials

Crimes on the high seas

The location of persons who are fugitives from justice by reason of violations of the Federal Laws over which the Bureau has jurisdiction, of escaped Federal prisoners, and parole and probation violators.

It will be appreciated if information in the possession of law-enforcement officials concerning the above listed violations is promptly forwarded to the Special Agent in Charge of the nearest office of the United States Bureau of Investigation. If the information indicates that immediate action is necessary, telegrams marked "Government Rate Collect" or telephone calls will be accepted. The address of each of the Field offices of this Bureau appears on the inside back cover of this bulletin.

The American people have every right to feel gratified at the steadfastness displayed by the law-enforcement officials and agencies during the crisis from which the nation now seems to be emerging. In spite of economic hardships and increased responsibility in protecting life and property, the "Peace-time Soldiers" of the various communities have held their lines. There has been no weakening of morale. Those responsible for law-enforcement have not yielded to the despair of "Calamity Howlers". Determination, fortitude, and resolution - these are the qualities that have made successful the united effort against crime and criminals. The few exceptions where crime has not been solved merely served to prove the predominant situation. If further proof is needed, the following comparative facts illustrate a greater degree of cooperation and progressive accomplishment during these times of stress. Let us use the month of January as an index. The number of fingerprints received in the Identification Division of the United States Bureau of Investigation has progressively increased as follows:

The above figures certainly indicate that law-enforcement agencies are increasingly more alert and that they recognize more and more the value and need of cooperation. That these figures are truly representative is shown by the total number of fingerprint cards on file in this Bureau on January 31st of each of the following years:



Of course, with this large number of fingerprints available, the United States Bureau of Investigation has been in a position to be progressively of more effectiveness in results obtained, as is shown by the total number of identifications made in one month of each of the following years:

When it is recognized that there is no Federal law compelling law-enforcement officials to contribute fingerprints, and in view of the fact that this cooperative endeavor is entirely voluntary, the increased accomplishments recorded are all the more remarkable, and are typical of the progressive spirit which prevails among law-enforcement officials throughout the nation. This spirit of cooperation overcomes many of the handicaps occasioned by the limited jurisdiction of each agency, and the United States Bureau of Investigation is proud of the opportunity to be a part of this united effort.

The spirit of cooperation has spread throughout the nation and we are all glad to cooperate in order to bring about a more rapid recovery. As a part of this program, and consistent with the need for economy, we are, as previously announced, limiting the distribution of these bulletins to those who are contributors of fingerprints to the Identification Division of this Bureau. However, all regularly constituted law-enforcement officials and agencies are invited to become contributors of fingerprints, and thus to avail themselves of the full value of this service.

MEMORANDUM RELATIVE TO APPLICATIONS FOR THE EXTRADITION
FROM FOREIGN COUNTRIES OF FUGITIVES FROM JUSTICE.

DEPARTMENT OF STATE,

Washington, September, 1921.

Extradition will be asked only from a Government with which the United States has an extradition treaty, and only for an offense specified in the treaty.

All applications for requisitions should be addressed to the Secretary of State, accompanied by the necessary papers as herein stated. When extradition is sought for an offense within the jurisdiction of the State or Territorial courts, the application must come from the governor of the State or Territory. When the offense is against the United States, the application should come from the Attorney General.

In every application for a requisition it must be made to appear that one of the offenses enumerated in the extradition treaty between the United States and the Government from which extradition is sought has been committed within the jurisdiction of the United States, or of some one of the States or Territories, and that the person charged therewith is believed to have sought an asylum or has been found within the dominions of such foreign government.

The extradition treaties of the United States ordinarily provide that the surrender of a fugitive shall be granted only upon such evidence of criminality as, according to the laws of the place where the fugitive or person so charged shall be found, would justify his or her commitment for trial if the crime or offense had been there committed.

If the person whose extradition is desired has been convicted of a crime or offense and escaped thereafter, a duly authenticated copy of the record of conviction and sentence of the court is ordinarily sufficient.

If the fugitive has not been convicted, but is merely charged with crime, a duly authenticated copy of the indictment or information, if any, and of the warrant of arrest and return thereto, accompanied by a copy of the evidence upon which the indictment was found, or the warrant of arrest issued, or by original depositions setting forth as fully as possible the circumstances of the crime, are usually necessary. Many of our treaties require the production of a duly authenticated copy of the warrant of arrest in this country; but an indictment, information, or warrant of arrest alone, without the accompanying proofs, is not ordinarily sufficient. It is desirable to make out as strong a case as possible, in order to meet the contingencies of the local requirements at the place of arrest.

If the extradition of the fugitive is sought for several offenses, copies of the several convictions, indictments, or informations and of the documents in support of each should be furnished.

Application for the extradition of a fugitive should state his full name, if known, and his alias, if any, the offense or offenses in the language of the treaty upon which his extradition is desired, and the full name of the person proposed for designation by the President to receive and convey the prisoner to the United States. It should also contain a statement to the effect that it is made solely for the purpose of bringing about the trial and punishment of the fugitive, and not for any private purpose, and that if the application is granted, the criminal proceedings will not be used for any private purpose.

Copies of the record of conviction, or of the indictment, or information, and of the warrant of arrest, and the other papers and documents going to make up the evidence are required by the department, in the first instance, as a basis for requesting the surrender of the fugitive, but chiefly in order that they may be duly authenticated under the seal of the department, so as to make them receivable as evidence where the fugitive is arrested upon the question of his surrender.

Copies of all papers going to make up the evidence, transmitted as herein required, including the record of conviction, or the indictment, or information, and the warrant of arrest, must be duly certified and then authenticated under the great seal of the State making the application or the seal of the Department of Justice, as the case may be; and this department will authenticate the seal of the State or of the Department of Justice. For example, if a deposition is made before a justice of the peace, the official character of the justice and his authority to administer oaths should be attested by the county clerk or other superior certifying officer; the certificate of the county clerk should be authenticated by the governor or secretary of state under the seal of the State, and the latter will be authenticated by this department. If there is but one authentication, it should plainly cover all the papers attached.

All of the papers herein required in the way of evidence must be transmitted in duplicate, one copy to be retained in the files of the department, and the other, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, will be returned with the President's warrant, for the use of the agent who may be designated to receive the fugitive. As the governor of the State, or the Department of Justice, also ordinarily requires a copy, prosecuting attorneys should have all papers made in triplicate.

By the practice of some of the countries with which the United States has treaties, in order to entitle copies of depositions to be received in evidence the party producing them is required to declare under oath that they are true copies of the original depositions. It is desirable, therefore, that such agent, either from a comparison of the copies with the originals or from having been present at the attestations of the copies, should be prepared to make such declaration. When the original depositions are forwarded, such declaration is not required.

Applications by telegraph or letter are frequently made to this department for its intervention to obtain the provisional arrest and detention of fugitives in foreign countries in advance of the presentation of the formal proofs upon which a demand for their extradition may be based. Such applications should state specifically the name of the fugitive, the offense with which he is charged, the circumstances of the crime as fully as possible, and a description and identification of the accused. It is always helpful to show that an indictment has been found or a warrant of arrest has been issued for the apprehension of the accused. In Great Britain the practice makes it essential that it shall appear that a warrant of arrest has been issued in this country. |

Care should be taken to observe the provisions of the particular treaty under which extradition is sought, and to comply with any special provisions contained therein. The extradition treaties of the United States may be found in the several volumes of the Statutes at Large, and in the compilation entitled "Treaties, Conventions, International Acts, Protocols, and Agreements between the United

States and Other Powers," issued in three volumes by the Government Printing Office. Copies of particular treaties will be furnished by the department upon application.

If the offense charged be a violation of a law of a State or Territory, the agent authorized by the President to receive the fugitive will be required to deliver him to the authorities of such State or Territory. If the offense charged be a violation of a law of the United States, the agent will be required to deliver the fugitive to the proper authorities of the United States for the judicial district having jurisdiction of the offense.

Where the requisition is made for an offense against the laws of a State or Territory, the expenses attending the apprehension and delivery of the fugitive must be borne by such State or Territory. Expenses of extradition are defrayed by the United States only when the offense is against its own laws.

A strict compliance with these requirements may save much delay and expense to the party seeking the extradition of a fugitive criminal.

GLASS FRACTURES

Important evidence of value may be obtained at times from an examination of glass which was broken during the commission of a crime. It may be possible to ascertain from which direction the blow came which was responsible for breaking the glass. When the shape of the hole made by the blow is of an elongated type, there may be an indication as to the direction in which the blow was traveling at the time it struck the glass.

It has been found that glass usually breaks first on the side opposite that which receives the blow, the reason being that glass will withstand more pressure than "stretching" force. When glass is struck, it "bends" in the direction of the blow, and causes the glass on the opposite side to be "stretched", and that "stretching" not only causes the break to occur first on the side opposite that which received the blow, but it also causes the hole in the glass to be funnel-shaped, with the largest opening on the side away from that which was struck. In addition to this, glass breaks which result from a relatively small object striking the pane of glass occur in patterns more or less similar in type, depending of course upon the similarity of the blow and the kind of glass involved. Usually, however, at the point struck, a hole is made which may be described as similar to the hub of a wheel, and cracks will appear leading out in all directions from this hole like irregular spokes. Other cracks will appear and extend irregularly from one "spoke-like" break to another, thus causing three-cornered pieces of glass to be broken off. The breaking of these pieces of glass will leave typical marks on the edges which, upon examination, may be seen frequently without the use of microscopic assistance, and these marks indicate the position of the small pieces in the large pane which was broken. These marks which are seen on the edge of the glass will be observed to curve from one side of the edge to the other (See Figure 3). They will be found to be approaching a position parallel to one side and almost at right angles to the other side of the edge of the piece of glass examined. If the side of the pane which is struck be called the "front", when typical three-cornered pieces of glass are examined after a glass fracture, it will be found that the lines on the edge of these pieces are almost parallel to the "front" side on the two edges formed by the "spoke-like" breaks in the glass. On the third edge, however, the pattern is reversed in that the lines here are almost at right angles to the "front" side of the glass. The reason for this difference which causes one edge of the three-cornered piece of glass to bear the reverse pattern from the other two edges, is that the break along this third edge, being away from the point where the blow came in contact with the glass, is caused by the "bending" of the glass from the opposite side, and causes the "stretching" on the "front" side where the blow occurs, which presents exactly the reverse direction of the force present at the place where the hole is made by the blow.

When, during the course of an investigation, it becomes important to prove the manner in which a pane of glass was broken, all the pieces should be collected. The edges can then be examined and the pieces put together in so far as possible, so as to replace the pane in its original form.

Figure 1 in the attached plate will show the funnel-shaped type of hole made by a blow striking a pane of glass, and furnishes an illustration of the fact that the hole thus made is larger on the "back" side than on the "front" of the glass which was broken. Figure 2 will show a portion of the reconstructed pane of glass, and illustrates the direction which the lines of the break will usually take after a fracture occurs. Figure 3 will illustrate the lines found on the three sides of one of the pieces of glass formed by the breaking of a pane of glass.

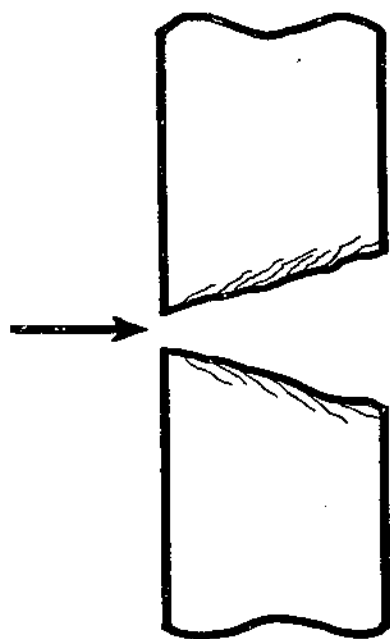

Side view of glass showing shape of aperture and side from which the blow came.

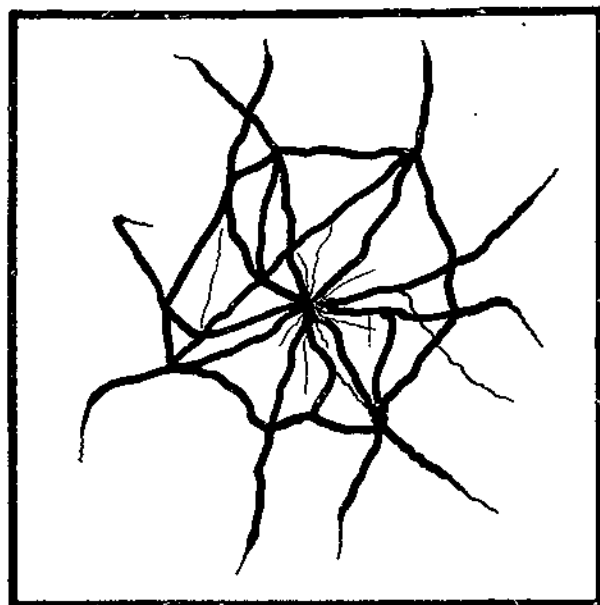

Showing radial cracks and typical triangular form of segments of a reconstructed pane.

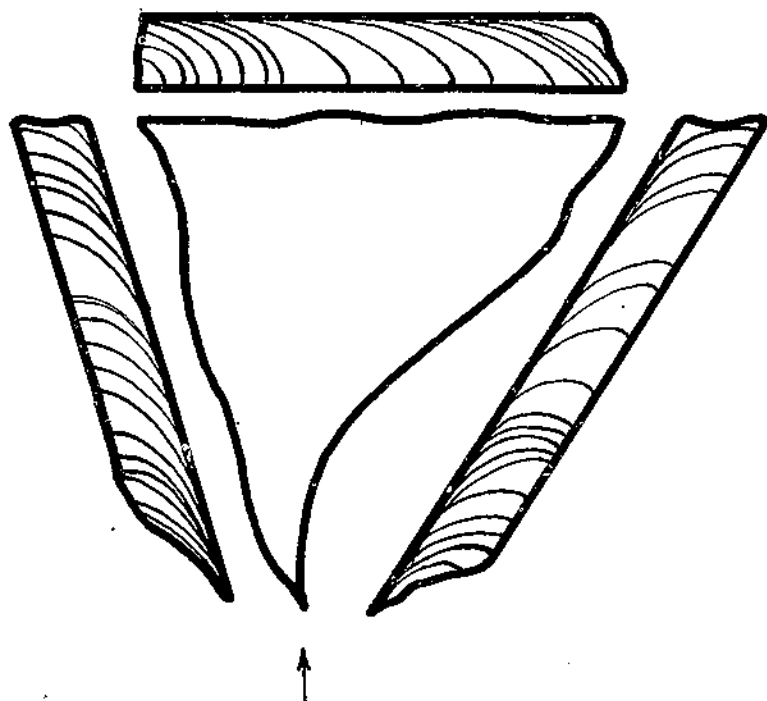
