The many helpful suggestions received from law enforcement officials and agencies throughout the nation have been most gratifying and helpful in the preparation of and plans for the bulletin entitled "Fugitives Wanted by Police". You will observe that the United States Bureau of Investigation in preparing this bulletin has already initiated the practice of printing the wanted notices on one side of a page based upon the suggestion that they might be clipped from the page and pasted on cards for filing in the records maintained. Many other suggestions and comments have been received which are most encouraging for the continuance and increased practical value of this bulletin. These suggestions are being studied for future application consistent with the practical problems and usages involved in the development of this cooperative service.

Some suggestions have been made that occasion might be taken to stimulate increased use of the facilities of the identification work of the United States Bureau of Investigation by a brief explanation of the operation and effectiveness of this central clearing house for fingerprint identification. Although its value is recognized by the more than 5100 law enforcement agencies and institutions which contribute fingerprints to this Bureau, it is realized that its increased use is valuable to new contributors as well as to those already receiving the advantage of this service, who, of course, understand its operation.

Since 1924 this Bureau has been operating this national identification project. In promoting its development hundreds of law enforcement associations, agencies, and officials have effectively cooperated with this Bureau in what is undoubtedly the greatest national cooperative step yet undertaken for the prevention of crime and promotion of law enforcement. More than 5100 law enforcement agencies are now sending fingerprints to this Bureau. Approximately two thousand sets of prints are received each day. More than three and one-quarter million fingerprint cards are now on file. The new cards as they arrive are searched among those already received and nearly 43% are found to have previous records. The contributor is advised of the previous record by letter mailed frequently on the same day the prints are received and certainly within thirty-six hours. Each name and alias is indexed and added to the more than 4,300,000 index cards already maintained as an aid in identifying arrested persons. The information furnished is, of course, of almost indispensable value to the peace officer as well as to

the prosecutor and the judges who impose sentences. It is obvious that many fugitives wanted in remote parts of the country are identified and located among the approximately 860 identifications made each day. In addition, upon receipt of the fingerprints or names, aliases and descriptions of fugitives wanted, a notice is posted in the Bureau's files, and when information is received concerning such fugitive it is immediately sent to those desiring his apprehension. About 250 fugitives are located in this manner each month. This bulletin includes information concerning some of the fugitives for whom wanted notices have been filed. Any regularly constituted law enforcement official or agency can avail itself of this service. Those not already taking advantage of this cooperative endeavor can do so by writing this Bureau, and instructions, cards for taking prints, and envelopes requiring no postage will be sent without cost. There is no charge for any part of this service. You get the advantage of having the prints searched among all prints received from other contributors. This collection of prints, which is the largest of its kind in the world today, operates at a saving of thousands of dollars annually to police departments, sheriffs, and other agencies and institutions. An estimate of the economical advantage of this project to each state, county, and municipality can be made by calculating the cost and labor involved in taking the prints and distributing them to the other contributors and in the preparation of the many replies which would be necessary. Likewise, when the dispositions of the arrests made are furnished this Bureau still further savings are effected in correspondence and time.

Your use of this service is invited and your continued cooperation is appreciated by the many other contributors, as well as by the United States Bureau of Investigation, which is dedicated to the principle of cooperation in the exchange of ideas and information in our mutual cause of effective law enforcement.

LATENT FINGERPRINTS

Latent fingerprint impressions may be defined as those markings, usually rather indistinct, left by oily matter or perspiration exuded from the fingertips upon any substance which the fingers may touch. In some cases, depending upon the physical condition of the person leaving the impressions, as well as upon the article touched, these impressions are so distinct they are visible to the naked eye, while in other cases they appear to be very faint and require development or "bringing out" through the application of powders or other means in order that they may be so intelligible they can be photographed or that other reproductions of the prints, as hereinafter described, may be effected.

Authorities differ as to the time latent fingerprints will remain upon any object touched. Atmospheric conditions may affect them slightly, but the physical condition of the person leaving the latent impressions, considered with the surface to which the latent prints are adhering, will affect their duration considerably. It is somewhat unnecessary to indicate that latent prints might not remain for an appreciable period upon paper not having a glossy or hard surface, such as blotting paper, and that their presence might not be detected in all instances were they to be made upon most articles of clothing, towels, pillows, and the like. It is sufficient to state that they remain intelligible and readily susceptible of development for several days where they are placed under ideal conditions. For example, if they appear upon a piece of glass, steel, or other hard surface non-porous material, it is usually possible to develop them, through the application of the proper materials or substances, several days after they are so placed. The best results, however, usually may be obtained shortly after the latent impressions are made, while the greatest amount of perspiration or oily substance is still adhering to the article touched and they are not affected by dust, dirt or other foreign matter.

Searching for Latent Prints

The search obviously should be conducted in a systematic, intelligent manner. Concentrated attention would be given to determining the probable existence of prints on such objects as guns, windows or other glass and other places where they would be most likely to appear. It is desired to stress the point that no objects should be removed

from their original positions or touched with the bare fingers while the inspection outlined is being conducted and that all objects touched should be handled gently. Care should be taken to protect or preserve intact any print developed on any object, which should be wrapped, if feasible. An endeavor also should be made to detect latents which do not overlap or merge, as this affects their appearance and value, defeating the possibility of ridge analysis in many instances.

Elimination of Suspects

Following the location of any latent fingerprints at the scene of a crime, the prints of all persons, whose occupancy of the place under inspection has been for legitimate purposes, must be excluded from further inquiry. It is advisable, therefore, during the initial stages of the investigation where latent fingerprints are found to exist, to secure the prints of all members of the household, the servants, and any police or other officials who may have come into contact with the object. This, of course, must be done to find "strange" prints or prints of an individual who has not frequented the room theretofore. It is sometimes necessary to take into consideration the appearance of the prints when they are first discovered; i. e., whether they are clear or a slight film of dust appears over them. This is important as a suspect may enter the defense that he was in the room legally at some time before the actual commission of the crime and may have touched the object under discussion then.

Development of Latent Impressions

Various powders and liquids, et cetera, are used in this work. The powders in general usage are, a white or grey powder which usually consists of finely ground chalk and mercury, and a black powder which usually has lampblack or charcoal as a base. There are a number of excellent powders on the market. The field offices of the United States Bureau of Investigation use powders of the type described for their work in this particular. They also use finely ground aluminum and bronze powders as well as dragon's blood powder, and a special white powder. These powders may be purchased from a chemist or druggist, although specially prepared powders are sold by concerns which advertise in peace officers' journals. It is desired to emphasize that in many instances it is not necessary that any powders be applied to a latent fingerprint impression to develop it, as sometimes the impression appears clearly. It should be borne in mind that the powders are to be used to bring the print to a point where it may be photographed or otherwise developed, and that when the print as placed may be photographed, as for example, where a print may show distinctly in the oil on an automobile, no powder should be used. In addition to the powders, the application of iodine fumes is sometimes used to develop prints which are so latent, usually appearing on paper, that ordinary powders do not assist in

bringing them out. Examination by ultra-violet rays is also employed in this work. However, powders are generally utilized. It is essential that the problem of employing powders which contrast in color with the surface upon which the latent print appears be given serious consideration, and that at the same time the problem of using the powder best adapted to the particular surface under examination be studied. The black powder is best used on all paper and hard surfaced or enamelled objects of a light color. This powder, however, is not adapted particularly for certain white surfaces, as for example, it will not adhere satisfactorily to glass finished in white. On the contrary, the white powder is well adapted to use on all glass surfaces, while the aluminum, bronze, and dragon's blood powders usually are employed on highly polished or hard surfaces also, such as silverware and metallic objects. The necessary work usually can be done, however, through the application of the white, mercury and chalk, or black powders.

In the actual search for latent fingerprints, the assistance of a flashlight or the lights appearing in a standard fingerprint camera sometimes is helpful, in that the lights reflected from unusual angles sometimes show the presence of latent fingerprints. When a print is observed and the operative is not certain which of the particular powders he has in his possession is best adapted for use on the surface where the latent print appears, it is well for that operative to apply fingerprint impressions of his own to a section of a similar surface and then determine which of his powders is most suitable for bringing out the said prints. Powder of the same type then should be used on the latent print. Through taking this precautionary measure the operative does not incur the chance of obliterating the prints permanently. This thought must be kept foremost in mind at all times. When the operative has decided upon the proper powder to employ a very small amount should be applied to the brush used in the development of the latent print. An excessive amount of powder should never be placed upon a print as it may destroy permanently the characteristic details. After the powder has been applied to the brush, it then should be run very lightly from one side over the print until the characteristic outlines begin to show. Once the said lines assume their definite formations the operative should "brush up" the print through applying the powder either directly across the impression as he would apply it in the case of an arch pattern or with a sweeping or circular motion as he would apply it in the case of an average whorl pattern. In other words, the operative should try to brush the powder over an impression so the motion or strokes of the brush will conform to the lines of the pattern. This enables the pattern to be brushed without destroying the ridges. Powder may be added where necessary and any excess blown away. On some surfaces, such as fibrous papers, it is not advisable to employ a brush, the best results usually being achieved by placing a small amount of powder on one end of the object or paper, holding it at a slant, and tapping the same lightly so the powder will pass over the latent print, leaving sufficient particles adhering to bring out the impression. Sometimes latent prints are "set" or "fixed" by the proper application of heat.

Where it is necessary for the operative to cover a large surface such as the door of a safe where it has not been possible for him to see latent fingerprints with the naked eye, the powder atomizer or spray with aluminum or bronze powder, or a proper mixture of powders most appropriate for purposes of contrast, should be used in order that the prints may be identified. It is essential here also that a minimum amount of powder be blown in the initial stages of this work since too much powder used at one time in the atomizer as well as in the brushing work will tend to obliterate the pattern entirely. After the impressions appear on the surface being sprayed, any excess of powder may be blown away by the use of the atomizer bulb.

Photographing of Latent Impressions

The usual type of camera employed to photograph latent impressions is that equipped with batteries and bulbs, employing a fixed focus so the camera may be placed directly over the object to be photographed and exposed without the infiltration of outside light. The packed film or cut film holder are used for this work. To load the film holder the cut film should be taken to a dark room and one piece, after the covering is removed, placed inside the holder in the proper grooves with the niche or slot on the film appearing in the lower right-hand or upper left-hand corner. The film in the holder is held in place through the manipulation of the prongs at the ends. When the film is not exposed the shield should be inserted with the aluminum side facing "outward" and when the film has been exposed the aluminum side should face inward. This enables the operative to know the condition of the film at a glance.

Experience and practice alone will acquaint the operative with the proper "timing" to be had in photographing latent fingerprints. Consideration must be given to contrasts in powders and surfaces, the strength of the batteries, the "speed" of the film, etc. Obviously, a sharp contrast of white powder on black or black on white would require less timing than aluminum or bronze on green. It is advisable, therefore, particularly for the novice, to take three or four exposures of varying length, as, for example, five, ten, fifteen and twenty seconds. The best negative should be retained. It is possible, frequently to offset incorrect timing somewhat by added care in developing.

Care must be exercised to see that all latent prints developed and photographed for possible evidential purposes are marked properly so they may be identified readily. The person taking the photographs should witness the actual development and printing of his negatives so he can testify, if necessary, that they are the same. Only a professional photographer, in the absence of a regular police photographer, should be permitted to develop and print the latent negatives, as he also usually must testify.

It is advisable to indicate the exact location or spot where the

latent or latents were found, the distance from a door, position upon a bed post, etc. Noting these facts may affect the entire presentation of the case. Therefore, all photographs or exhibits should contain reference thereto. If feasible, the object upon which the latent was found should be introduced in evidence with the actual latent. After powdering, the latent may be covered with a piece of isinglass or cellophane wrapper for protection, if necessary.

"Lifting" of Latent Impressions

Sometimes, due to poor contrasts, reflections of light, variegated colors of an object upon which a latent print is found or the physical location of such print, it is not possible to photograph it effectively. In such instances, the process known as "lifting" is employed. Many good lifters are on the market. The same general principle is followed in using each. After removing the covering or transparent shield which usually is employed to protect the "sticky" or mucilaginous side of the lifter, a piece sufficiently large to cover the fingerprint should be placed gently, immediately over the impression to be lifted. The lifter should be pressed down firmly and evenly to insure the removal of every portion of the fingerprint from the article or surface, to the tape. When all particles have adhered to the lifter it should be "peeled off" or raised gently from the object it has covered and the actual fingerprint will be found on the lifter. The covering should then be placed back on the lifter to protect the impression.

Many fingerprint officers emphasize the point that the lifting process should be employed only when it is impossible to secure good photographs of latent impressions. They indicate that lifted prints themselves must be photographed and enlarged for comparative and evidential purposes, thus bringing another operation into the case, which may tend to confuse the jury, generally unaccustomed to this type of evidence. They indicate, also, that a latent print, "lifted" to tape, usually is "reversed" and must be photographed in proper order for comparative purposes. They point out finally, that "lifting" destroys or obliterates a latent, so it is not available for another trial at lifting or available on the original object, for exhibit in Court, if necessary. These views are submitted for appropriate consideration.

When "lifting" is necessary, many officers employ photographic film, with the gelatin layer removed by "hypo" solution for this purpose, the sticky side being applied to the powdered print. Others use inner tube patching, of a smooth, even finish. Material which does not possess "graining", lines or spots, and which is not so mucilaginous is always most effective. Material too spongy or absorbent will absorb entirely all particles of powder, destroying the print outline.

Characteristic Analysis of Prints and Expert Witness Testimony

After the latent print has been found and photographed it becomes necessary to locate the actual print corresponding to the latent. It should be borne in mind that usually it is impossible to identify a latent or single fingerprint with prints in a large collection unless some facts are available to indicate the probable identity of the suspect. For example, if a latent impression is forwarded to the United States Bureau of Investigation the Bureau's technical experts, because of limitations of time are not able to conduct detailed or prolonged searches of its 3,300,000 prints which possibly would lead to the determination of the identity of the offender. However, if the names and descriptions of suspects can be furnished and their prints identified in the Bureau's files, the latent and actual prints will be compared by the Bureau's technical experts to determine if they are those of the same individual. As a consequence of the necessity for procuring immediately fingerprints for comparison with the latents, it must be borne in mind at all times that the fingerprints of every person who may have committed a particular offense should be procured at the earliest possible date.

It follows from the foregoing that the obtaining of latent prints, however clear, is generally but the initial step in this work. When obtained, they are valueless unless actual prints can be procured for comparative purposes. When actual prints are obtained which contain characteristics identical with the latent prints, it is customary for the operative to prepare enlargements of the latents and actuals, whereon the identical points are noted by lines and definitions directed thereto.

Latent fingerprint testimony has been accepted in evidence in numerous Courts and jurisdictions. The application of the fingerprint science as a valuable adjunct in criminal prosecution would obviously suffer if officers not well versed in the science of Dactyloscopy were to testify in Court. It is obvious, therefore, that one of the most important phases of the work connected with the development of latent fingerprints consists of effective testimony presented in Court by competent experts. It is appreciated that an official must at some time qualify as an expert, in order that he may be so considered by the Courts. It is not meant to imply in the observation outlined above that only an officer who at one time has testified should be considered as an expert. However, it is felt that the progress of the fingerprinting science as an aid to law enforcement would be retarded through the presentation of prosecuting or defense testimony by incompetent individuals who are not fully instructed or cognizant of the correct interpretations, analysis and explanation of fingerprint patterns.

The expert, after qualifying as a witness, usually indicates the most distinctive points in the latent and actual impressions. For example, he may cite four bifurcations, six ending ridges, two islands, and two dots which occur identically in both impressions. It seems

to be rather well established that twelve or fifteen identical points will suffice. This, however, is a matter which is influenced largely by the pattern area appearing in the latent print, whether it is large or a fragment, whether the characteristics are near the focal points, i.e., delta or core, whether the prints are of an unusual type, etc. In other words, the expert must satisfy the jury that the prints are identical and necessarily made by the same finger. Where only fragments of impressions are contained in the latents, it is sometimes necessary to go into the highly technical study of Poroscopy or pore counts and analysis. Extreme technical care and skill are needed in this work.

In the preparation of enlargements of latent and actual fingerprints for presentation in Court, care must be exercised to see that the said fingerprint impressions are prepared according to the same scale, in order that all the points under consideration may appear to have the same relative size and position on the fingerprints. It would be eminently desirable, of course, if the photograph of the latent fingerprint could be prepared in an enlarged manner on a piece of glass and placed over the actual fingerprint so that all the characteristics would match perfectly. However, the preparation of exhibits in chart form usually suffices.

It happens upon occasion that the fingerprint expert when examining the evidence, may be satisfied in his own mind that the latent fingerprint impression is from the same finger as the actual impression of a finger which he has under consideration. Occasionally the latent and inked impressions may show many apparent variations, which may occur where a difference in pressure, application of powder, or related conditions would affect them. In such instances it is advisable to endeavor to have the suspect touch or place his fingers upon the same type of object as that from which the latent fingerprints were taken; to have the prints so placed developed with the same type of powder or developer used in the preparation of the latent fingerprints found at the scene of a crime, and to prepare the exhibits accordingly. An exact comparison is then available.

General

It should be noted that this resume of latent fingerprint work has been prepared by the United States Bureau of Investigation, as of possible interest to law enforcement officers who desire to avail themselves of fingerprint evidence in connection with their criminal identification activities. It should be borne in mind that the comments and expressions set out in this manuscript are not intended to convey the thought to the mind of the reader that the Bureau believes the points emphasized in any instance are the only proficient ones, or that other methods of developing latent fingerprints are not equally acceptable. As indicated, this manuscript is prepared merely for the review of law enforcement officers who are interested in this work. special or particular consequence which may occur to any law enforcement agency or officer who may review this paper.

For the reference and information of law enforcement agencies, the United States Bureau of Investigation also has compiled a digest of certain leading Court Decisions with reference to fingerprint evidence. This digest which contains the comments or opinions of several Courts with reference to fingerprint evidence possibly will be of assistance to law enforcement agencies to whom information of this character may not be readily accessible. The compilation mentioned, of course, includes only a few of the many cases presented and sustained in Court in connection with fingerprint evidence. The United States Bureau of Investigation also has available for distribution to interested law enforcement agencies, copies of the decision rendered by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals in the case of United States v. Kelly, which may be of interest to law enforcement agencies in connection principally with the question of legality of fingerprinting. The Bureau also has available for distribution copies of the Modification and Extension of the Henry System of Identification as employed in the United States Bureau of Investigation.
