Continued enthusiastic endorsement of the previous issues of this bulletin from all sections of the country is most gratifying. This encouragement and recognition bespeaks a potential value which it is firmly believed will be realized in direct proportion to the use which is made of this service. The United States Bureau of Investigation is particularly pleased to have received many valuable suggestions for the improvement or increased value of the list of "Fugitives Wanted by Police." This is indicative of the real attitude which it was desired would be taken, namely, that each recipient consider this a cooperative endeavor and thereby feel free to offer opinions, submit suggestions, and advise of the results obtained. This brings about a wholesome cooperation between law enforcement agencies all over the nation in furtherance of law enforcement activities.

Every suggestion received will be given careful study and utilized wherever possible and practicable. None of them has been rejected. Their accumulation will form a basis for real study and application consistent with the use and results obtained. While pioneering in this further use of the service available in the identification work of the United States Bureau of Investigation, it is hoped full freedom will be felt to advise concerning any specific instances wherein results have been obtained. These results prove the value of the project.

The names listed herein have not by any means included all those for whom wanted notices have been filed with this Bureau, as to date only a few of the major violations have been considered in preparing the bulletin. And it is of course understood that the many wanted notices which have been filed and which are not included in these lists to date will receive the same careful attention, upon receipt of a print showing the location of the person wanted, as is given to those herein listed. Full use of the facilities of this Bureau is therefore invited by filing requests for wanted notices to be placed in the identification files and records, regardless of the offense. The names and descriptive information included in this and previous issues are based on letters received showing that the persons are wanted for the reasons shown.

It is believed, of course, that records are being placed in the files of the recipients of this bulletin as an aid in identifying and

locating the fugitives who are wanted. Obviously, therefore, upon the location of the fugitive or upon receipt of information showing the fugitive is no longer wanted because of death, dismissal of charges, or other reasons, if notice to such effect is forwarded to the United States Bureau of Investigation, the apprehension or cancellation can be published in order to clear the files of those who utilize this plan of mutual helpfulness and cooperation.

Some extension will be noted in the use of standard abbreviations in this bulletin and further need will call for increased application. Suggestions will be welcomed as to this feature.

An exchange of ideas between law enforcement agencies and officials is a basis for progress. Research, study and experience produce knowledge. It is, therefore, believed by this Bureau that knowledge acquired in various phases of law enforcement activities will be of most value if passed on for the benefit of all who are engaged in the same pursuits. With this in view it may be found possible from time to time for the United States Bureau of Investigation to serve as a medium of exchange for the dissemination of such knowledge and ideas. In furtherance of such a belief there is being included in this bulletin an article entitled "Explosives" which is being used with the permission of the author. This Bureau will be glad to receive from you an expression of your opinion relative to the continuation of such service rendered by its Research Division in your interest.

EXPLOSIVES

Police officers often are called upon to act in emergencies brought about by the finding or explosion of bombs. It is important for the public and their own safety that they know just what to do when such a crisis confronts them. If they know just what to do, and do it promptly, they may save the lives of innocent bystanders and their own.

The object of this Special Bulletin is to give police officers a few facts on explosives and advice on what to do when they find them. Explosives with which officers are apt to come in contact are gunpowder, dynamite, nitroglycerin, and blasting caps (fulminate of mercury).

GUNPOWDER - Gunpowder is made active by a spark or flame and requires no other device as a detonator. Immersion in water will render gunpowder ineffective at once and it becomes useless as an explosive when thoroughly damp.

DYNAMITE - The explosion of dynamite is brought about by a strong shock, initiated by a blasting cap or detonator, and not by a flame or heating. A high power rifle bullet will explode dynamite readily. Dynamite will stand considerable rough handling, but rough handling certainly is not recommended.

NITROGLYCERIN - Nitroglycerin is a yellowish oily liquid, very sensitive to shock. It is best destroyed by exploding it from a safe distance in some isolated location, or by pouring the contents of the bottle into a bucket half-filled with water, so that it will not spill over the top, and transporting it to a large body of water and pouring it in. Do not pour nitroglycerin on the ground expecting it to evaporate and disappear entirely. Instead, it will seep into the ground and retain its explosive qualities and a sharp blow, such as some one striking the ground with his heels, will detonate it.

BLASTING CAPS - Dynamite blasting caps are about the most innocent looking high explosives on the market. Their bright shiny copper cartridges, about the size of a .22 long, are particularly fascinating to children, who may try to either shoot them in sling shots against a brick wall, or pick the white stuff out of them with a pin. Caps found should be carefully packed in cotton or excelsior, and never allowed to remain or be anywhere near dynamite. One cap is sufficient to tear a foot or hand to shreds. Fulminate of mercury, the compound with which blasting caps are charged, is very sensitive to shock and friction. Blasting Caps therefore, should be treated with respect. Fulminate can be fired by friction, blows, spark, fuse, or by action of sulphuric acid.

BOMBS IN PACKAGE FORM - There is no safe method of opening package bombs, and opening them should never be attempted. These contrivances are so made that they will explode when the package strings are pulled, when the wrapper or wrapping paper is being removed, or when the lids of the boxes are raised. They may be exploded in a multitude of other

ways, so they are best left alone. Should a package bomb tick, then there is a real need for speed in disposing of it, for it is almost certain that it is a time bomb and timed to explode at some particular hour, and there is no way of telling when that hour is. Whenever a suspected bomb is found, it should immediately be taken to a safe place and destroyed from behind cover with a machine gun or high power rifle, or thrown into a water hole, and watch kept until it explodes. In transporting suspected bombs, they should be covered with a mattress, planks, or other material calculated to minimize damage if the bomb should explode. Spectators, especially children, must be kept away.

FUSE BOMBS - Pull out the fuse and get rid of it. The dynamite itself is safe, but remember that the fuse CANNOT be extinguished by stamping on it, or by throwing it into water, so don't waste time trying these methods, but get rid of the fuse and cap, as the cap is a high explosive, having enough force to blow holes into 1/4 inch thick pieces of aluminum, or tear a hand or foot to pieces. The fuse consists of a center thread surrounded by a train of special powder made for fuse, and inclosed in various wrappings of textiles and waterproofing materials, protecting the powder from abrasion and water. The fuse carries the fire uniformly and continuously and burns at a rate of from 30 to 40 seconds per foot of fuse. If a bomb is thrown at you, grab the fuse and pull it out. Don't be afraid to pull hard, you have to work fast. If there is not time to grab the bomb, drop to the ground with the head away or covered, and lie flat until it explodes. Guard your eyes.

Report promptly to Headquarters when explosives are found. Under no circumstances should explosives be stored in offices or station houses. The following explosives may be safely handled and taken to explosive manufacturers for possible identification as to where same were obtained:

Sticks or boxes of dynamite, when not primed. Dynamite is usually made up of sticks of 1 1/4 by 8 inches, and should an odd size stick be found, it can probably be traced. Boxes in which dynamite is packed are marked with code numbers, thus making identification probable.

Blasting Caps must be wrapped separately and not carried loose in pockets, or kept in close contact with dynamite. Fuses, of course, are safe if kept away from fire.

Gunpowder should be immersed in water and kept away from flame. Watch cigarettes, hot cinders from passing trains, or sparks from iron and flint.

When known criminals, safe blowers in particular, are arrested, and a bottle or can found on their person or in their automobile, and the contents looks like moonshine whiskey, never take it for granted that it is whiskey, as nitroglycerin is practically of the same color, and criminals carry nitroglycerin in this manner. Before destroying the container found on the criminals, first smell the contents. If the odor is not that of whiskey, regard it as

nitroglycerin, also pour a small quantity on your hand, and, if it has an oily feel, you may be pretty sure it is nitroglycerin and take proper precautions in handling it.

X-RAYS

The United States Bureau of Investigation desires to supplement the above by suggesting one method of determining the contents of suspicious packages which may be used with safety when there are no indications, such as a ticking sound, that a bomb is present of the type which may explode at any predetermined time.

By this method the package is exposed to Roentgen or "X-rays". Photographs are taken or an observation is made of the image on the fluoroscope screen. If a bomb is present, the mechanism may sometimes be seen or photographed through the wrapper. The trigger mechanism may sometimes be avoided in this way during the further examination of the package.

The fact that the package does not contain a bomb may sometimes be readily ascertainable. If the package or wrapper is made of a metal or other material which is as opaque to X-rays as the contents, this method will probably not be effective.
