The United States Bureau of Investigation is charged with the duty of investigating violations of the laws of the United States and collecting evidence in cases in which the United States is or may be a party in interest.

The Bureau does not have investigative jurisdiction over violations of the National Prohibition, Counterfeiting, Narcotic, Customs, Immigration, or Postal Laws.

However, the United States Bureau of Investigation will immediately institute investigations of alleged violations of Federal Laws other than those listed above.

The following list indicates some of the major violations over which the Bureau has investigative jurisdiction:-

National Motor Vehicle Theft Act

National Bankruptcy Act

White Slave Traffic Act

Impersonation of Government Officials

Larceny of Goods in Interstate Commerce

Cases involving transportation in interstate or foreign commerce of any persons who have been kidnapped

Theft, Embezzlement or Illegal Possession of Government Property

Antitrust Laws

National Bank and Federal Reserve Act Violations, such as embezzlement, abstraction or misapplication of funds

Crimes on any kind of Government reservation, including Indian Reservations or in any Government building or other Government property

Neutrality violations, including the shipment of arms to friendly nations

Frauds against the Government

Perjury, embezzlement, or bribery in connection with Federal Statutes or officials

Crimes on the high seas

The location of persons who are fugitives from justice by reason of violations of the Federal Laws over which the Bureau has jurisdiction, of escaped Federal prisoners, and parole and probation violators.

It will be appreciated if information in the possession of law-enforcement officials concerning the above listed violations is promptly forwarded to the nearest office of the United States Bureau of Investigation. If the information indicates that immediate action is necessary, telegrams marked "Government Rate Collect" or telephone calls will be accepted. It is frequently observed that in well administered business enterprises, whether it be in manufacturing, farming, mining or other forms of endeavor, studies are made for the purpose of obtaining the greatest amount of benefit from the possibilities at hand. The by-product of a factory, farm or mine has in many instances been developed into the principal business of the industry. Such advantages are effected after conscientious study, research and work with the object in view of producing the greatest amount of service, profit, and utility. The consummation of these objectives is an indication of efficiency. Certainly, the same careful planning and administration should be applied to the biggest business of all - the service of government. With such purposes in mind let us turn our attention to the growth and development of the Identification Division of the United States Bureau of Investigation.

In 1924, the Identification Division was created as a part of this Bureau upon recommendation of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, and by authority of Congressional enactment. As has been previously pointed out, this cooperative endeavor, the greatest of its kind ever undertaken in the war against crime, by the law-enforcement officers and agencies of the nation with the United States Bureau of Investigation, has resulted in the development of this division into the largest reservoir of criminal records based on fingerprints of current value, in the world. At the time of its beginning it offered the immediate advantage of serving as a clearing house for the receipt, classification and filing of fingerprints of arrested persons with the arresting officials being notified of the previous record already on file. This, of course, is being continued as a primary function of the project. But what additional service and advantage is available? The following are submitted as some of the more important developments:

"Wanted Notices" are being filed in this division in order to ascertain the location and obtain the apprehension of individuals whose whereabouts are unknown. Peace officers have the opportunity of requesting that the files of the Bureau's Identification Division be "flagged" so that when information is received showing the location of an individual whose arrest is being sought, the official making this request will be immediately notified. When it is realized that over 2,000 fingerprints are being received each day the probability that your "Wanted Notice" will produce results becomes apparent. Therefore, you are invited to make full use of this service.

The advantages of the records on file are valuable, not only as to arrested persons, but an opportunity is available for obtaining information concerning an applicant for a position in your department or office, as well as in other branches of the Civil Service, when such applicants have an arrest record in the files of this Bureau.

Amnesia victims have been identified following the receipt of fingerprints in this division.

The identity of unknown deceased individuals may be established in the same manner.

EXAMINATION OF METALS.

The scientific examination of metals is sometimes advantageous to investigations. An analysis may be made to determine the chemical substances of which the object is composed. It is not necessary for investigators to know the details of the method of doing this, as the results are obtained by experts, after the investigator has found such action necessary.

Knowledge of certain other methods of examining metals is sometimes useful in obtaining information, for two purposes: the identification of a piece of metal as having been part of a larger piece, and the restoration of identifying numbers. Both of these processes utilize a method called etching. The surface of objects of iron or alloys of iron, upon being polished, treated with the etching solution and then viewed through a microscope, present distinctive crystalline structures. The distinction in these patterns is due to the fact that differences are created by the conditions under which the metal exists. The forces acting on the metal are, during its life, different for each object. Blows, heat and chemicals change the crystalline patterns. A metallic object from which a smaller piece is cut will, unless some unusual condition has operated on one or the other, display the same structure within a reasonable time after the separation. This is particularly useful when at the scene of a crime, there is found a metallic object which has probably been cut from a larger piece in the possession of a suspect. For instance, in the case of a home-made bomb, part of the mechanism might have been manufactured from a larger piece of metal. When this is the case, it is advantageous to seek a piece from which it might have been cut and submit the two for examination to a metallurgist.

The method used in this examination is to polish the metal very finely, without scratches and with a finish like glass. The surface is then treated with the etching solution (given hereafter), following which it is examined under the microscope.

RESTORATION OF NUMBERS.

Objects which bear identifying numbers, such as revolvers, knives, automobile engines and parts, typewriters and instruments, are frequently encountered in investigations. Sometimes it is found that the numbers are not visible because the metal has been ground or beaten. When this is done, the use of the object may be destroyed or rendered dangerous, because the metal has been weakened.

The best method of restoring the number is to first use the so-called etching treatment. In this method, if the surface is irregular, it is smoothed down with emery, care being taken to see that very little metal is removed. For this purpose, it does not have to be glass-smooth. After this is done, the etching solution is applied. The solution suggested by the Bureau of Standards and found to have been most useful is given as follows:

4 parts, by weight, copper ammonium chloride.
48 parts, by volume, hydrochloric acid.
48 parts, by volume, distilled water.

There are two methods of applying the solution. One is to simply rub it on the metal. Another method which has been found efficacious in such instances is to moisten a cotton swab with the acid, which is then rubbed into the copper ammonium chloride and finally onto the metal, repeatedly. In either method, the solution should be rubbed into the surface of the metal until the numbers appear or until such time as all hope of their appearing fails. It sometimes takes hours to produce the numbers. If it is finally decided that this method will not restore the numbers, the heat treatment may then be applied. The fact that acid has previously been used does not, in any way, interfere with the heat treatment. In fact, both treatments may be used at the same time and one assists the other. In view of the fact that there is danger of spoiling the metal in the heat treatment, it is always desirable to first use the acid.

The heat treatment consists of carefully heating the metal until the numbers appear. It is not necessary to heat the metal to a particular color. If the numbers do not appear by the time the metal reaches a color below the cherry red, the test should be discontinued. Heating a metal beyond this point is quite likely to cause injury. It is necessary in heating metals to see that the heat is applied evenly so that the object heated is not twisted or warped. When heating automobile engine blocks, a method of preventing the cracking of the block is to fill the jacket with water.

STATISTICS COMPILED FROM FINGERPRINT CARDS

February 1, 1932 -- January 31, 1933

In collecting fingerprint records from police departments throughout the country, the Identification Division of the United States Bureau of Investigation incidentally accumulates a large volume of information regarding some of the personal characteristics of the persons arrested. In order to make this information available for those interested in it, the United States Bureau of Investigation began early in 1932 to tabulate data taken from fingerprint records regarding the type of crime committed, and the age, sex, and previous record of the person arrested. In order that the data might be limited to the records of arrests, prints showing the commitment of a person to a penal institution were not used in this tabulation. Likewise, prints received from Federal law enforcement officials were excluded. In other words, the tabulations contain data regarding persons arrested for violations of State laws. The figures should not be interpreted as representing the amount of crime committed or the total number of persons arrested, since the United States Bureau of Investigation does not receive prints for every individual arrested throughout the country.

During the twelve month period from February 1, 1932 through January 31, 1933 the records of 305,095 persons arrested were examined. Males constituted over nine-tenths of those arrested, females numbering only 22,288 (7.3%).

The group representing persons 19 years old contributed 15,987 (5.24%) which exceeded the number contributed by any other single age group. The second largest number was that contributed by those 22 years of age and numbered 15,482 (5.07%). These two age groups constituted 10.3% of all the arrest records examined during the twelve month period. It was seen further that 1 of every 5 arrested was under 21 years of age, that 4 out of each 10 arrested were under 25 years of age, and that approximately three-fourths of all arrests were of persons under 35 years of age. Persons of extreme youth were represented among the arrest records examined, there being 801 persons arrested who were under 15 years of age. Of these more than half were charged with burglary or larceny, 57 with auto theft, and 21 with the offense of robbery. Even among persons so young there were 6 charged with having committed homicide, and in addition thereto there were 12 persons aged 15 who were charged with this offense.

Arrests for drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, and on suspicion or for investigation totaled 88,707. Deducting this number from the total arrests during the twelve months leaves a remainder of 216,388. Of this latter number more than half were arrests for larceny-theft,

As mentioned above the records of 22,288 females arrested were examined. Over half of them were charged with vagrancy, sex offenses, larceny, or held on suspicion or for investigation. Of the females arrested a larger percentage was charged with larceny than was true in the case of the males, but the women figure much less prominently than men in such offenses as robbery and burglary. Of each 100 women arrested 17 were charged with larceny and only 5 were charged with either burglary or robbery, whereas among each 100 men arrested 13 were charged with larceny, 11 were charged with burglary, and 6 were charged with robbery.

Youths contribute a large percentage of those arrested for the offenses of auto theft, burglary, robbery, and larceny-theft. Youths are especially predominant among those arrested for auto theft. The records examined show that 2 out of 4 arrested for auto theft are under 21 years of age and 1 of the remaining 2 is between the ages of 21 and 24 inclusive. It further appears that youths aged 17, 18, and 19 are more frequently arrested for this offense than are those of any other age group.

As to the offense of burglary, the records received by the United States Bureau of Investigation tend to indicate that 4 of each 10 burglars arrested are under 21 years of age and that of the 6 remaining 2 are between the ages of 21 and 24 inclusive.

For the offenses of robbery and larceny-theft youths are frequently arrested but somewhat less often than was seen to be the case in connection with the offense of burglary.

The offenses of forgery, counterfeiting, embezzlement, and fraud are apparently the field of more mature persons. More than half of those arrested for forgery and counterfeiting were between the ages of 20 and 34 inclusive, and 8 of each 10 arrested for embezzlement and fraud were over 24 years of age.

As might have been expected, more than 80% of the persons arrested for offenses against the family and children were over 24 years of age.

It is seen that arrests for violations of the Narcotic Drug Laws are comparatively few, numbering only 2,887. Almost 70% of those arrested for this offense were between the ages of 25 and 44 inclusive. The 30 to 34 age group contributed a larger number of those arrested for this offense than did any other corresponding age group. It is significant, however, to note that about 10% of the total arrested on the charge of violating the drug laws were aged 22, 23, and 24.

Persons under 25 years of age constituted about 40% of those arrested for disorderly conduct, vagrancy, and violations of Traffic and Motor Vehicle Laws.

As to the offense of felonious homicide, 1 of each 4 persons arrested for this offense was under 25 years of age, and 2 of the remaining 3 were between the ages of 25 to 44 inclusive.

In a large proportion of the 305,095 arrest records examined, the files of the Identification Division of the United States Bureau of Investigation revealed that the person had previously been arrested and fingerprinted and his prints forwarded to Washington. Of those charged with violating the Narcotic Drug Laws 55.6% had a previous record on file. The next highest percentage of repeaters was 42.2, found among those arrested for forgery and counterfeiting. The percentage of repeaters varied between 35 and 40 for persons charged with embezzlement, fraud, robbery, drunkenness, and burglary, whereas for larceny-theft and auto theft the corresponding percentages were a little lower. The number of repeaters among those arrested for other offenses ranged from approximately 30% to 20.4%. One out of 5 of those charged with felonious homicide had a previous record on file in the Identification Division.

At the end of January, 1933, there were almost 3,400,000 criminal fingerprint records on file in the United States Bureau of Investigation at Washington, D. C. The number of police departments, peace officers and law-enforcement agencies throughout the United States and foreign countries voluntarily contributing fingerprints to the Bureau at the end of January totaled 5,425. During January, 1933, 388 fugitives from justice were identified through fingerprint records and information as to the whereabouts of these fugitives was immediately transmitted to the law-enforcement official or agency desiring to apprehend these individuals. Of each 100 fingerprints received during January, more than 44 were identified with criminal data in the files of the Bureau. The index cards on file at the Bureau containing the names or aliases of individuals with criminal records totaled 4,484,482 on January 31, 1933.
