The Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice, is charged with the duty of investigating violations of the laws of the United States and collecting evidence in cases in which the United States is or may be a party in interest.

Crimes on any kind of Government reservation, including Indian Reserva-
tions or in any Government building or other Government property

Neutrality violations, including the shipment of arms to friendly nations

Frauds against the Government

Crimes in connection with Federal Penal and Correctional Institutions

Perjury, embezzlement, or bribery in connection with Federal Statutes or
officials

Crimes on the high seas

Federal Anti-Racketeering Statute

The location of persons who are fugitives from justice by reason of vio-
lations of the Federal Laws over which the Bureau has jurisdiction,
of escaped Federal prisoners, and parole and probation violators.

The Bureau does not have investigative jurisdiction over the violations
of Counterfeiting, Narcotic, Customs, Immigration, or Postal Laws.

Law enforcement officials possessing information concerning violations
over which the Bureau has investigative jurisdiction are requested to
promptly forward the same to the Special Agent in Charge of the nearest field
office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice.
The address of each field office of this Bureau appears on the inside back
cover of this bulletin. Government Rate Collect telegrams or telephone calls
will be accepted if information indicates that immediate action is necessary.

Nationwide interest has been shown in the extension of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's program of cooperation with law enforcement agencies through the Police Training School which was begun at the Bureau, in Washington, D. C., on July 29, 1935.

In view of the numerous applications and inquiries received at the Bureau concerning the Police Training School, and further, that the method of choice in sending invitations to attend the school may be fully understood, I feel it desirable to explain the manner in which the facilities of the Police Training School are being made available to the law enforcement agencies throughout the country.

The selection of those who are to attend the Police Training School of the F. B. I. is based upon applications received by the Bureau from law enforcement agencies. There is no set form of application. A written request, to send a representative to the school, addressed to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, United States Department of Justice, Washington, D. C., will suffice. It should be observed that the invitations are extended to the law enforcement organization and not to individuals. Those receiving such invitations should bear in mind the nature of the course and the qualifications of the personnel in their departments in making the selection of a representative, who will be able, upon completion of the course, to serve in the best possible manner the organization which he represents. The Bureau has not indicated any specific requirements in the nature of qualifications for those selected but has allowed the organization invited to choose its own representative. Upon receipt of such an invitation, the law enforcement agency may elect to send the Chief of Police, Sheriff, the Superintendent, Director, or other executive official in charge of the organization, or any other person officially connected with it.

The facilities available for extending to law enforcement officers the courses of instruction in the Police Training School are limited. It will, therefore, be necessary to limit the number who will be in attendance at each of these schools and because of the large number of applications received, it is impossible to determine how long it will be before an invitation may be extended to any one department or organization.

However, the Bureau will be pleased to receive applications from regularly constituted law enforcement agencies and these applications will be recorded, so that they may receive appropriate consideration in connection with the selection of personnel to attend schools of this type, which will follow that presently being conducted at the Bureau in Washington, D. C.

USE OF IDENTIFICATION ORDERS

The Federal Bureau of Investigation issues Identification Orders containing fingerprints, photograph, descriptive data and the criminal history of individuals whose apprehensions are desired by the Bureau. It has been the Bureau's experience that the most effective use made of these Identification Orders is their being filed in the permanent fingerprint files of the various police departments and other law enforcement agencies, under the appropriate fingerprint classification, so when the fugitive is arrested and fingerprinted by a police department or sheriff's office, his fingerprints are immediately identified in the fingerprint file.

Law enforcement agencies which are not receiving a sufficient number of copies of Identification Orders issued by the Federal Bureau of Investigation so that one copy is available for immediate filing in its Identification Unit while copies are being used in Detective Bureaus and other investigative units, are requested to advise the Bureau or the nearest field office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in order that arrangements may be made to furnish a more adequate supply.

MOULAGE

An important field in identification work is that of reproducing evidence in plastic form. This is generally referred to as the Moulage method. The absolute accuracy of detail that is possible in reproducing any object with the Moulage method makes it of great value to law enforcement officials in their application of scientific methods to crime problems.

Since evidence in important crimes must be studied thoroughly over a period of time for the possible leads that can be detected from it, preservation of that evidence is highly important. Several problems arise in connection with the preservation of evidence and its proper recording for future use in checking and comparative purposes. Photography has been utilized to a large extent, proving of great value in recording and preserving the scene of the crime and particular exhibits of evidence. While photography has been developed to a high state of perfection, it still has disadvantages. Owing to physical conditions of light and space, it is often impossible to obtain a photograph that will be an absolute, correct impression of the facts. The photograph fails to reproduce one essential part of a particular object of evidence, mainly its third dimension, depth, and often that detail is necessary to make an identification. Then to, in many cases it is highly desirable that the exact form of a particular object with all dimensions be retained for later use. This, except for some process of creating an exact model might be impossible because of the danger of deterioration, putrefaction, or decomposition.

The application of the Moulage process does not require any great amount of training or any particular technique. Anyone with a little practice can turn out very commendable work, the complete instructions furnished by the manufacturers of the various Moulage products being of great assistance.

The actual process consists of the making of a negative mould and a positive cast; the material for the negative is a colloid preparation, while the material used in the positive cast is a resinous wax. They both require heating before being applied. After being heated the negative material is applied to the object with a brush or spatula. The negative hardens upon drying, and is easily separated from the object by peeling or cutting away. The heated positive material is then poured into the negative mould and allowed to cool. When that hardening process is finished the negative mould is peeled, cut away or slipped off the positive form and the particular piece of work is completed, giving a reproduction of the object in its finest details of form and texture.

The Moulage method offers practical use in the field, as well as in the laboratory, because the Moulage material may be transported from the laboratory to the scene of the crime in vacuum bottles or jugs, as the occasion requires. The reproduction can be made while the object remains in its original position, if desired, and without any difficulty or elaborate preparation. Reproduction of evidence by this method is so simple that its possibilities should be fully ap-

preciated by all law enforcement officials. It should be thoroughly understood, resulting as it does, in giving a reproduction of subject-matter in three dimensions.

There are many uses for Moulage in the field of scientific crime detection. Wound marks in deceased persons have been preserved. The actual impression of a wound itself may be taken, to preserve its actual length, depth, and appearance for later use. Imprints in sand, dust, or mud; foot prints, tire marks; knicks or marks made by chisels, or other instruments used to effect entrances in burglary cases, have all been preserved by the Moulage method. For example the method is used where it is impractical to saw out a piece of window frame, in order that the mark left by a crow bar may be available, for comparison with a crow bar found in a suspect's possession or picked up in the investigation of a burglary case. A plastic impression can be easily carried by the investigative officer which serves every purpose that the original evidence could serve in giving him assistance. The Federal Bureau of Investigation has also made extensive use of Moulage for the purpose of reproducing guns for exhibit purposes.

Heretofore we have mentioned some of the possibilities of plastic reproduction in connection with regular crime detection. There is another important use in the field of law enforcement and that is the officers' task of identifying dead persons. Dr. Alphonse Poller, the Viennese scientist and founder of the Poller Moulage Method gives several interesting examples where identification of unknown dead was effected by plastic post mortem reconstruction. In these cases identification from photographs has been unsuccessful. Quoting Dr. Poller: "Casts were taken from bodies of three unknown men. In one of these the forehead was badly disfigured by a deep gash reaching to the root of his nose, through which the brain was oozing. The contour of the damaged area was easily restored on the cast, and thus through a simple reconstruction a life-like result attained. The father who identified his son was thereby spared the shock which the disfiguring wounds would have otherwise caused him."

"In the second body the face was of a dark blue-red color and spotty. In such cases, a photograph naturally results in an unrecognizable picture. The cast, however, reproduced only the colorless form, and could be painted in natural living tones, thus making the identification much easier. A cast of the third victim was taken without any alterations."

"It is interesting that in all three cases the relatives were not able to recognize their dead from the photographs shown them, whereas the casts made identification possible beyond any doubt."

The Federal Bureau of Investigation assisted in an interesting case involving the murder of a negro girl, whose body was found in a District of Columbia sewer. At the time the body was recovered it was badly decayed and mutilated. Rats had so destroyed the features of the girl that identification was impossible. However, by the application of Moulage, a death mask was made, the missing features were reconstructed and worked into a complete mask. This mask was used during



the investigation and ultimately the girl's mother was charged with her child's murder.

With the efforts being extended to identify the unknown dead, this use of Moulage should not be overlooked. Unidentified persons may be buried at once, as with a death mask and a cast of any other identifying marks preserved, a permanent record is made. It follows, then, that it is a far more effective means of preserving evidence than a photograph.

The law enforcement officer of today must be constantly on the alert for improvements for overcoming his law enforcement problems. The use of Moulage, drafted from the field of medicine and art, to the special needs in crime detection and identification work is advocated not to supplant other methods, such as photography, but rather as an aid. In many instances Moulage is the only ideal method of preserving evidence for subsequent scrutiny and study. As a court room presentation of evidence it is invaluable. Supported by photographs the introduction of a plastic model which gives a third dimension provides a graphic exhibit clearly understood by judge and jury. The importance of this phase need not be dwelled upon. If all evidence at the scene of the crime such as tire marks, foot prints, etc. have been preserved for reference, the investigating officer establishes himself in the eyes of the judge and jury as a thoroughly competent witness who knows how evidence must be properly preserved and presented. Moulage thus offers the medium which, in many cases, has been lacking for the assistance of the court in deciding upon the guilt or innocence of an accused.

STANDARDIZATION OF WANTED CIRCULARS

The great number of fugitives located in other jurisdictions is one of the most convincing arguments for the need of the closest possible cooperation in exchanging information between law enforcement officers throughout the country and the Identification Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Realizing the importance of WANTED NOTICES through the use of which most of such apprehensions must of necessity be effected, and believing that a uniform WANTED NOTICE would materially facilitate their filing, the Bureau in the October 1933 issue of the Fugitives Wanted by Police bulletin, set out certain suggested standard forms.

During an open forum discussion, of the Police Training School being held at the F. B. I. at this time, it was suggested and unanimously agreed, that the majority of law enforcement agencies desire a standardized WANTED NOTICE. It was recommended that the size of all WANTED NOTICES be 8 x 8 inches, permitting filing by classification in the fingerprint files of each Identification Bureau.

There are therefore, appended herewith for the assistance of those interested law enforcement officers who do not have available the sample notices, as were set out in the Fugitives Wanted by Police bulletin of October 1933, figures 1 and 2, explaining the exact form of WANTED NOTICE, which it is believed would prove most effective. Figure 1 illustrates a completed notice, while figure 2 indicates the nature of the contents thereof.



A MAN WITHOUT A COUNTRY.

An interesting story of a man without a country has been brought to the attention of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, in a circular received from the Seattle, Washington office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service of the United States Department of Labor. This man is one Joe Error, an individual now in Canada.

The Immigration and Naturalization circular requests all border ports to watch for this person and prevent his entry into the United States. It appears that if Joe Error succeeds in entering the United States, it will be difficult, if not impossible to cause his deportation to another country.

Early in 1935, Error was the subject of arrest and deportation proceedings in this country for the perpetration of a confidence game at Tacoma, Washington. Proceedings were directed to effect his deportation to Canada, since he had been issued a certificate of naturalization in that country in November of 1927, but his admission into Canada was refused by the Canadian authorities, and the Canadian Immigration Officials began proceedings for a cancellation of his Canadian Citizenship. While at liberty from the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service, under bond, he surreptitiously gained admission into Canada. Meanwhile, on June 7, 1935, his Canadian certificate of naturalization was revoked on the ground of misrepresentation of criminal record.

Joe Error was born in Servia, which is now Yugoslavia. However, deportation to that country is questionable, as the Yugoslavian Consulate might claim that Error had foresworn all allegiance to Yugoslavia, by reason of his Canadian naturalization.

The Identification Division files of the F. B. I. disclose that Error was arrested in Canada on 27 different occasions from 1916 to 1934. Most of the arrests were for minor offenses such as gambling, drunkenness, vagrancy, and creating disturbances. He was arrested twice in the United States, by the Police at Tacoma, Washington in August, 1934, on a charge of investigation and by the Police at Seattle, Washington, in September 1934, on a charge of investigation-bunco. As a result of the latter charge he was taken into the custody of the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service and the deportation proceedings, to which reference was made above, were instituted against him. In view of the information recently furnished by the Seattle office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, a notation has been placed against the fingerprint record of Joe Error, in the Identification Division of the Bureau, to the effect that that office should be notified if Error reenters the United States.

MODUS OPERANDI OF A. B. CREAGH
WANTED FOR OBTAINING MONEY UNDER FALSE PRETENSE.

Rear Admiral Richard E. Byrd has advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation of the recent activities of one, A. B. Creagh, an individual who was formerly connected with the Byrd Antarctic Expedition. Creagh as a secondary cook on the vessel Jacob Ruppert in September 1933, made the first trip to the Ice Barrier, returning on the ship to New Zealand, where the ships were laid up for the winter.

Captain English, who was in charge in New Zealand, had a great deal of difficulty with Creagh, who, under various pretenses obtained money from citizens of New Zealand. Because these individuals did not desire publicity, there was no prosecution for these offenses, however, it finally became necessary for Captain English to have Creagh incarcerated for thirty days for pilfering expedition property. Upon his release he was sent back to the United States.

Since Creagh's return to the United States in the Spring of 1934, he has been travelling about the country posing as an accredited representative of the Byrd Antarctic Expedition, collecting money under this pretense. His method is to take orders for Little America covers, pelts, etc., makes talks before various clubs, collect money as a result of these enterprises and then disappear.

Recently Creagh, representing himself as being connected with the Byrd Expedition, gave a talk before a woman's club in Philadelphia. He took orders for pelts and covers among the several hundred members, gave no receipts, and the defrauded club members have heard nothing from him since.

Admiral Byrd advises that neither he nor his representatives have heard anything directly from Creagh since he left the expedition in New Zealand, and that Creagh's only known address is c/o Seamen's Institute, New York City.

The Identification Division of the F. B. I. advises that a search of the files reflects that Creagh was held on a charge of forgery by the United States Secret Service in New York under the name of Albert Burton Creagh #328, on September 11, 1925. Restitution was made to the Government and Creagh was released.

The foregoing information is being brought to the attention of all law enforcement officials, as it is believed that officers, being informed of Creagh and his activities, may investigate more intelligently, complaints of this type of fraud. Admiral Byrd is particularly desirable of having Creagh's activities brought to the attention of law enforcement officials, so that it may be known that Creagh is not associated with him and is merely using his former employment to obtain money under false pretenses.

CARE OF WEAPONS

Weapons, the firing mechanisms of which include recoil springs, should not be put away with the recoil springs compressed. The Colt Monitor, Thompson submachine gun, and the shotgun, after cleaning, should have the breech blocks or bolts forward, or let down to release the tension on the springs. This is also true of the main or hammer spring of automatic pistols, as keeping the spring under tension for long periods of time will tend to weaken it. This may result in a misfire due to an insufficiently heavy hammer blow.

POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL FACULTY

The general type of instruction of the Police Training School of the Federal Bureau of Investigation is based upon that given to the Special Agents of the Bureau. The entire staff of instructors and lecturers of the Federal Bureau of Investigation is being used in conducting the Police Training School. Each of the staff has had valuable, practical experience in the field of law enforcement, is an expert in the course of instruction which he will give and is an experienced instructor both in the theory and practice of law enforcement.

In addition, forty-one outstanding criminologists and police officials, selected from higher institutions of learning, from police departments and other law enforcement agencies, will discuss and explain specific subjects to which they have given a lifetime of study and thought. HIT AND RUN DRIVER

The hit and run driver, though not commonly classed as a criminal in the sense of a kidnaper or bank robber, is nevertheless a criminal who must be dealt with by law enforcement officers.

The number of deaths, caused by persons being struck by automobiles is appalling. Too often the public welfare is menaced by the hit and run driver, who with wanton disregard leaves the victim of his onslaught and flees the scene of his crime. With righteous indignation, press and public call upon the law enforcement official to bring to justice the perpetrator of this offense.

Apprehending a hit and run driver and making a case against him, that will result in his conviction, is often a task that calls upon the law enforcement officer to exercise his best abilities in detection. Here, as in other fields of criminal investigation, much can be gained by a study of the possibilities that science offers in an aid in detecting and proving an offender guilty in a court of law.

An interesting case depicting the use of scientific methods in crime detection, in securing the conviction of a hit and run driver, is that of People vs. Wallage, 186 N. E. 540 (Ill. 1933).

A seven year old boy was struck and killed by a passing automobile while he was walking, with several other children, along the concrete slab on the State Highway, between Salem and Mt. Vernon, Illinois. Several cars passed the children before the fatal accident occurred. The defendant driving his automobile in the direction of Mt. Vernon, crossed over the black center of the slab and hit the boy. The impact was so great that the dead body was thrown twenty feet. As the driver did not stop one of the children remained with the body and another ran home to his parents telling them of the accident.

News of the accident was quickly telephoned to officers in Mt. Vernon, who stopped and examined all automobiles coming into Mt. Vernon. The automobile of the defendant was stopped and an oval-shaped dent was discovered on the left front fender. When the defendant stepped out of his automobile the officers smelled liquor upon his breath. He was bellicose and used abusive language to the officers. Two police officers, a state highway patrolman, the sheriff, and a deputy sheriff all testified that the defendant was drunk when his automobile was stopped. The front of the car carried a large, bright, single-bar bumper and it was observed the enamel had been removed in the dented part of the left front fender, disclosing the bright surface of the metal underneath.

The automobile was taken to a garage, transparent shellac painted over the dented part of the fender to keep the bright metal surface from tarnishing, and a portion of the fender containing the dent was removed and turned over to the county officers. The clothing worn by the boy at the time he was killed, with the damaged portion of the fender, was taken by the state's attorney to a chemist in St. Louis, who later testified as an expert witness in behalf of the State. This chemist, who had been

official state chemist in Missouri for twenty-one years, took samples of the paint from the fender at the place where the dent was made, and samples of the paint from the shirt worn by the deceased boy at the time of the accident, examined and compared them, and testified that they were of similar color. To make these tests he removed a small portion of the shirt with scissors and brought it into court at the time the exhibits were presented. He examined the dented fender under a microscope and found lines where the paint had been partially rubbed off. He found that there were thirty-one of these lines to the inch. He also examined the shirt worn by the victim, and stated that there were thirty-one raised threads per inch in the cloth of the shirt. He further found that there were scratches made on the fender a few inches below the dent. From an examination of these scratches under a microscope and an examination of the right suspender buckle in the back of the overalls worn by the child, he found that the scratches on the fender of the defendant's automobile were of the same contour, design, and size as the buckle of the overalls worn by Cecil on the night of the accident.

The defendant accounted for the dent in the fender by saying that a truck had backed into his automobile but made no further contradiction to the evidence, although he did charge that the removal of the piece of shirt and the suspender button from the decedent's clothing, together with the shellacking of the fender were substantial changes in the conditions of these exhibits.

Other points of error were raised not germane to this discussion, but the Supreme Court of Illinois affirmed the lower court's verdict of guilty. Concerning the particular point as to the evidence adduced, the court stated as follows: "No error was committed in allowing in evidence the shirt and overalls of the deceased child or that part of the fender containing the dent and the scratches made by the cloth and the overall buckle. The defendant charges a substantial change in the condition of those exhibits, but this is not substantiated by the record. The piece of cloth taken from the shirt was produced in court along with the buckle from the overalls. The dent in the fender was covered with transparent shellac by order of the sheriff in order that the bright metal surface opened up by removal of the paint covering it would not corrode. The clipping of the small piece out of the shirt, the removal of the buckle, and the shellacking of the fender did not constitute a substantial change in the condition of those exhibits."

This case demonstrates the readiness of the courts to accept the scientific means afforded to aid in the apprehension and conviction of criminals. To the law enforcement officer it is, likewise, a splendid example of the wide application and possibilities of methods developed in the field of scientific crime detection.

THE WHITE SLAVE TRAFFIC ACT

Between 1922 and July 1, 1935, over 45,000 cases involving alleged violations of the White Slave Traffic Act have been reported to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, United States Department of Justice. This Statute, which is frequently referred to as the Mann Act, became a Federal Law on June 25, 1910. It forms Section 397 through Section 404 of Title 18, United States Code, and is within the primary investigative jurisdiction of the Bureau, having entailed some investigative work on the Bureau's part in each of the aforementioned cases.

Briefly, this Act punishes any person who transports or causes to be transported in interstate or foreign commerce, any female for the purpose of prostitution, debauchery, or other immoral purpose. The term "interstate or foreign commerce" as used in this Act includes transportation from any state or territory or the District of Columbia, to any other state or territory or the District of Columbia and from any state, territory or the District of Columbia to any foreign country, and from any foreign country to any state et cetera. It will be noted that transporting for an immoral purpose from one place to another within any territory of the United States or the District of Columbia, is a violation of the Act. The sections of this Statute under which prosecutions are generally instituted, provide a maximum penalty of five years imprisonment or \$5,000 fine or both, except where the person transported is a girl under 18 years of age, in which case the penalties possible are doubled being ten years imprisonment and/or \$10,000 fine.

Some features of the White Slave Traffic Act that are not generally known are the following: Persons prosecuted under this Law are not always men, but in many instances are women who act as procurers or aid men in inducing the victims to transport themselves interstate for purposes of prostitution. Actually the transportation need not be for the purpose of placing the girl in commercialized prostitution, as the Act is technically violated where the victim is transported to become the mistress of the person causing the transportation, nor must the immoral purpose be actually consummated as long as the interstate transportation has been accomplished. In practice however, in accordance with the Attorney General's instructions considered hereinafter, such cases involving merely a personal escapade on the part of a man and woman are not considered worthy of investigation and prosecution. The fact that the person transporting a woman interstate for an immoral purpose is actually married to her, is no bar to his prosecution under this Act, nor does the fact that the woman consented to the instant transportation preclude his prosecution where the immoral purpose of the transportation can be established. In fact, the courts have held that a woman who is transported in violation of the White Slave Traffic Act may be guilty of conspiracy with the person transporting her to violate this Act. Further, the prosecution under the Act may take place in any district from, through which, or into which the interstate transportation has occurred.

Although all violations of the White Slave Traffic Act are investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the question of which cases are considered worthy of prosecution is left solely to the appropriate United States Attorney. The Bureau has no voice in the determination of this question.

Obviously, it was not the purpose of this Federal Law to punish all cases involving the interstate transportation of a woman for an immoral purpose, especially where local or State Laws are entirely adequate and more suitable of application. The Attorney General, in his instructions to United States Attorneys, has outlined the policy of the Department of Justice in this regard. These instructions are to the effect that only those cases in which the woman has been made to engage in commercial prostitution or in which other circumstances of aggravation exist, are proper for prosecution under the White Slave Traffic Act. In non-commercial cases the aggravating circumstance may be that the victim is a very young girl, or was previously chaste, or that either party is the parent of very young children whom they have deserted. The motives of the person making the complaint will be considered. For example, United States Attorneys are under instructions to avoid, so far as is possible, cases in which the making of the complaint is part of a scheme to blackmail the person complained against.

It is the earnest desire of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that law enforcement officers and agencies report to the Bureau field offices covering their respective districts, all violations of the White Slave Traffic Act falling within the purview of the above outlined Departmental prosecutive policy.

SEATTLE BANK ROBBER APPREHENDED

In the July 1935 issue of Fugitives Wanted by Police bulletin there was published certain information relative to the description and modus operandi employed by an individual who robbed the Seaboard Branch of the First National Bank, Seattle, Washington, on December 22, 1934, and the First Avenue Branch of the People's Bank and Trust Company, Seattle, Washington, on March 13, 1935, at which time law enforcement officers were requested to furnish any information in their possession, concerning robberies current or past, in which a similar modus operandi was used or information as to known or suspected bank robbers answering the description of the robbers of these two banks, to the nearest field office of this Bureau.

Subsequent to the publication of this information, one Paul Thornton Hursh was taken into custody in Juneau, Alaska, and returned to Seattle, Washington. Hursh was positively identified as the robber of these two banks and has also confessed to these robberies.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation desires to express its appreciation for the excellent cooperation and assistance rendered by various law enforcement officials in submitting information as to individuals and suspects answering the description of the robbers of these banks as published in the July issue of the Fugitives Wanted by Police bulletin.

THE TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR IDENTIFICATION convening at Montreal, Quebec, Canada, on July 17, 1935, adopted the following resolution advocating Universal fingerprinting and offering the Association's service therein:

"WHEREAS the members of the International Association for Identification, in Convention assembled, at Montreal, Quebec, Canada, have noted with great interest the increasing activities manifested in the expansion of fingerprints as a positive means of identification; and

WHEREAS it is the feeling of the Association that the utilization and recognition of fingerprints in the civil field constitutes a very desirable practice.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the International Association for Identification, assembled at its 21st Annual Convention, publicly endorse the expansion of fingerprinting upon a national or universal scale; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Association offer its full facilities and services to any individuals organizations interested in the consummation of this objective".

INTERESTING IDENTIFICATIONROBERT GREEN

SUBJECT ARRESTED BY NEW SCOTLAND YARD AUTHORITIES
IDENTIFIED BY BUREAU'S FINGERPRINT RECORDS AS
ESCAPE FROM COLORADO STATE PENITENTIARY

Although fourteen years had elapsed since his escape from the Colorado State Penitentiary in 1921, Robert Green, who was arrested by the Metropolitan Police Office, New Scotland Yard, London, England, in May, 1935, under the name of Thomas Walker, was identified as a fugitive when his fingerprints were submitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation by the New Scotland Yard authorities. Green had been received at the Colorado State Penitentiary in October, 1919, to serve a term of seven to eight years after conviction on a charge of forgery. In April, 1921, the Bureau was advised that he had escaped. Upon the receipt of this information a wanted notice was posted against his record in the files of the Bureau's Identification Division. Further advice was received in July, 1930, that he was still wanted by the Colorado Authorities.

On June 13, 1935, a fingerprint record was received in the Bureau's international exchange from the authorities of New Scotland Yard, London, England, reflecting the arrest of one Thomas Walker for the crime of breach of aliens order. This record indicated that Walker had been sentenced on May 18, 1935, to six weeks imprisonment at hard labor and had been recommended for deportation. When Walker's fingerprints were searched through the files of the Identification Division they were found to be identical with those of Robert Green, the escaped prisoner from the Colorado State Penitentiary. A communication was directed at once to the authorities in England furnishing advice of the fugitive status of this person, and the Warden of the State Penitentiary, Canon City, Colorado, was notified of this subject's arrest in England.

A communication was subsequently received in the Bureau from England stating that this person was being deported to America on a steamship sailing on July 4, 1935. Accordingly, telegraphic advice to this effect was furnished the Warden of the Colorado State Penitentiary on July 9, 1935. Shortly thereafter a telegram was received from the Warden of that institution stating that a request was being made for the New York Police to apprehend the fugitive upon his arrival in New York, and expressing appreciation for the Bureau's cooperation in this matter. When Green arrived at New York City he was taken into the custody of the United States Marshal on a charge of false statement in application for passport. On July 25, 1935, the New York City Police Department took custody of him on a warrant charging him with escape from the Colorado State Penitentiary.

This case is a splendid example of the value of the international exchange of fingerprints, which not only provides for a compilation of complete criminal histories, but also is of the utmost importance as a medium whereby fugitives under arrest in a foreign country may be identified as being wanted. It is interesting to note that at the present time 68 foreign countries cooperate with the Federal Bureau of Investigation in the international exchange of fingerprint data, and it is believed that the development of this activity has contributed materially to the cause of more effective law enforcement throughout the world.

INTERESTING IDENTIFICATIONJAMES JACKSON

VAGRANT WHO COMMITTED SUICIDE SHORTLY AFTER ARREST
IDENTIFIED BY FINGERPRINTS AS BADLY WANTED FUGITIVE

An individual who stated that his name was Mitchell Robertson was arrested by the Police Department at Sioux Falls, South Dakota, on August 6, 1935, on a charge of vagrancy, and within one hour after he was taken into custody he committed suicide by hanging himself in the City Jail. This subject's fingerprints had been taken immediately after his arrest and they were forwarded to the Bureau by air mail with a request that the authorities at Sioux Falls be notified by telegram if any important criminal data or information of the deceased person's residence should be disclosed in the Bureau's fingerprint files.

The fingerprints were searched through the files of the Bureau's Identification Division and it was found that this person had an extensive criminal career and was the subject of a wanted notice recently received from the Police Department at Kansas City, Kansas. That Department had notified the Bureau on July 1, 1935, that this person, as James Jackson, was wanted for burglary and larceny on 50 counts. Furthermore, the files reflected that he had served four terms in state penitentiaries for the offenses of burglary and carrying concealed weapons.

Shortly after the deceased person's fingerprints were received from the Police Department at Sioux Falls a telegram was dispatched to that Department advising that this person had been wanted by the Police Department at Kansas City, Kansas, for the offenses set out above and reporting pertinent data regarding his residence and birthplace, as reflected by the Bureau's records. The police authorities at Kansas City, Kansas, were notified of the fugitive's death at Sioux Falls, thereby enabling them to close this case in their records.

This case is of peculiar significance since it appears quite possible that the reason this subject committed suicide was the fact that he realized his identity as a fugitive would be disclosed through the fingerprints which had been taken shortly after his arrest. Moreover, it is an illustration of the desirability of forwarding fingerprints of deceased persons to the Bureau for the purpose of obtaining information as to the residence of the deceased person, when such information is not available from other sources.

OFFENSES KNOWN TO THE POLICE
JUNE AND JULY, 1935.

Under the system of uniform crime reporting, as adopted by the International Association of Chiefs of Police, monthly reports of known offenses are forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and tabulations based thereon are included in the quarterly publication entitled "Uniform Crime Reports". However, in order to make national data available at the earliest possible date, compilations based on the reports of the larger cities for June and July, 1935, are presented below.

The table shows the total number of offenses reported and the average for each day of the two months. In making comparisons to ascertain whether there have been increases or decreases in the amount of reported crime, the figures representing daily averages should be employed. The importance of doing so is illustrated by the fact that for burglary and larceny the number of offenses reported for July exceeded the corresponding figures for June. However, due to the fact that July has thirty-one days, whereas June has only thirty, the average daily number of offenses is lower for July than for the preceding month.

The compilation shows increases in offenses against the person (murder, negligent manslaughter, rape, and aggravated assault), and decreases in the number of offenses against property (robbery, burglary, larceny, and auto theft).


